






#### why home visits?











#### preparing for a home visit



- Call to confirm
- Review what you covered
- Plan what you will cover
- Have materials ready
- Have a materials backup plan
- Dress comfortably
- Charge your phone











### safety before a visit

- Go during safe hours
- Find out who will be in the home
- Go in pairs when possible
- Tell someone the details
- Have a 'what if' plan
- Bring only what you need
- Review in case of emergency (ICE) procedures










#### safety during a visit

- Don't bring valuables
- Avoid wearing known gang colors
- Avoid wearing necklaces or scarves
- Carry or wear identification
- Consider carrying a whistle
- Carry your phone
- Set your phone to vibrate
- Park smart
- Pay attention to your environment









- Check for exists and any visible dangers
- Sit close to an exit, facing the door
- Do not touch or pet animals
- Do not accept food or drink
- Do not reveal personal information
- Do not interact with participants on social media









#### safety after a visit

- Check your surroundings before entering car, lock your doors after
- Make sure your car is in good condition and prepared
- Wash your hands after each visit
- Document any suspicious activity







#### trust building





RESIST telling them what to do: Avoid telling, directing, or convincing your friend about the right path to good health.



**UNDERSTAND** their motivation:

Seek to understand their values, needs, abilities, motivations and potential barriers to changing behaviors.



LISTEN with empathy: Seek to understand their values, needs, abilities, motivations and potential barriers to changing behaviors.



**EMPOWER** them:

Work with your friends to set achievable goals and to identify techniques to overcome barriers.
